

Advocacy Checklist

Prevent the cliff in state homelessness funding and help secure a new state investment in the Housing Trust Fund. Please pledge to undertake several of these key advocacy strategies this summer and fall.

- ✓ Educate your state and local lawmakers.
 - * Arrange a meeting this summer or fall.
 - * Invite lawmakers to attend community events where they can learn more about affordable housing and homelessness.
- ✓ Collect stories and share your own.
 - * Stories that highlight the importance of the services funded by document recording fees,
 - * Stories that illustrate the need for more resources for homelessness services,
 - * Success stories that show the positive impact of affordable housing and homelessness services,
 - * Send all stories to KateB@wliha.org
- ✓ Use social media to educate and raise the urgency.
- ✓ Write letters to the editor to raise awareness.
- ✓ Attend candidate forums and ask questions of candidates.
- ✓ Make sure you are registered to vote and that your voter registration is current.
