Housing Alliance's 2017 lead agenda

- 1. Invest \$200 million into the Housing Trust Fund
- Prevent the cliff in state homelessness funding, including eliminating the sunset on the document recording fees and increasing the fee
- 3. Outlaw discrimination based on a renter's source of income
- 4. Protect and fully fund homelessness safety net programs including HEN, ABD, Medical Care Services and SSI Facilitation Services
- Ensure full Operating Budget authority for the 1115
 Medicaid Waiver for Permanent Supportive Housing

Appropriate \$200 million in the state's biennial capital budget.


2. Prevent the cliff in state homelessness funding.

- (a) eliminate the sunset of a portion of the document recording fees,
- (b) increase the document recording fee,
- (c) eliminate the 45% mandated use of state funds in the for-profit private market, and
- (d) streamline and improve state and county auditing and reporting requirements.




Pass a bill that changes state law to outlaw source of income discrimination.

4. Protect and fully fund homelessness safety net programs.


Protect funding for the HEN, ABD, MCS, and SSI Facilitation Services in the state operating budget. Appropriate \$5 million to the ABD program to fund its budget shortfall and ensure cuts are not made to the program. Raise new sources of revenue to fund the McCleary Supreme Court decision in the state operating budget.







Priority districts for mobilization in 2017



Trump presidency's impact on affordable housing and homelessness

At risk:

- Will National Housing Trust Fund see any additional funds?
- Cutting all non-defense spending by 1% per year for 10 years
- Tax reform could put the Low Income Housing Tax Credit at risk
- Significant risk of rolling back efforts to advance fair housing (AFFH rule)
