

Key threads across all Moving-On strategies at KCHA

- Each strategy required an Administrative policy change.
- Moving-on is voluntary and client centered.
- Each strategy utilized a common assessment tool to asses a clients ability to live independently without case management supports.
- Each strategy ensured that the referring agency provided housing relocation supports <u>and</u> crisis intervention services (as needed) for a minimum of one-year.
- Each strategy included ongoing supplemental safety-net supports (as needed) in the event a housing crisis.
