Homeless Student Stability Act (Proviso)

- Funding for schools to serve homeless students (supplement to federal funding);
- 2. Creates a grant program to directly increase housing stability for homeless students and families.

The Youth Empowerment & Reintegration Act (YEAR)

1. Eliminates non-restitution LFOs;

2. Gives judges discretion;

3. Affords youth the opportunity to get a record sealed after paying victims (if any) restitution.
